VBA Clinic Hours

Our hours of operation are as follows:

- The VBA Clinic Pharmacy is open Wednesdays from 9:00 AM - 12:00 Noon for distribution of new prescriptions and refills.
- All new prescriptions and refills must be called in or brought in on Mondays, Tuesdays, or Fridays, 9AM to Noon
- The VBA Health Clinic is open Monday through Friday, from 5:00 PM - 9:00 PM.
- The satellite pharmacy located in Englewood, Charlotte County, is open Wednesday and Thursday from 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM, and Friday from 1:00 PM - 5:00 PM.
- Appointments are required, walk-ins will be seen based on availability ; please call (941) 766-9570.**

Patient Eligibility

Eligibility for Episodic Medical Services

- Must be a resident of Charlotte County, Florida
- At least 18 years of age
- Have no health insurance.
- Annual household income must be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level for the size of your household.
 - For a single person, that means you can earn up to \$23,457 per year (approx. \$451 per week)
 - For a family of four, the limit is \$44,100 per year (approx. \$848 per week)
 - The limit varies depending on the number of people in your household
 - These figures based on US DHHS Federal Poverty Guidelines (Federal Register; 1/23/09), and are subject to change without notice.
- Some exceptions may apply; please call 941-766-9570 for more information.

Please provide the following documents for verification of financial eligibility at your first appointment:

- State-issued photo identification showing your current address.
- Any other government-issued identity cards.
- Some other proof of where you live (like a power or water bill).
- A list of everyone in your household-their names, ages, and relationship to you.
- Proof of household income (W-2s; copies of recent tax returns; stubs from paychecks or benefit payments; copies of alimony checks; award letters for child support, Social Security, unemployment assistance, and a description of any help you receive from other people, ministries, or agencies).
- The bottles for any medications, supplements, or vitamins you take or have recently taken.
- Any other medical records you might have.
- A list of your health questions or concerns.
